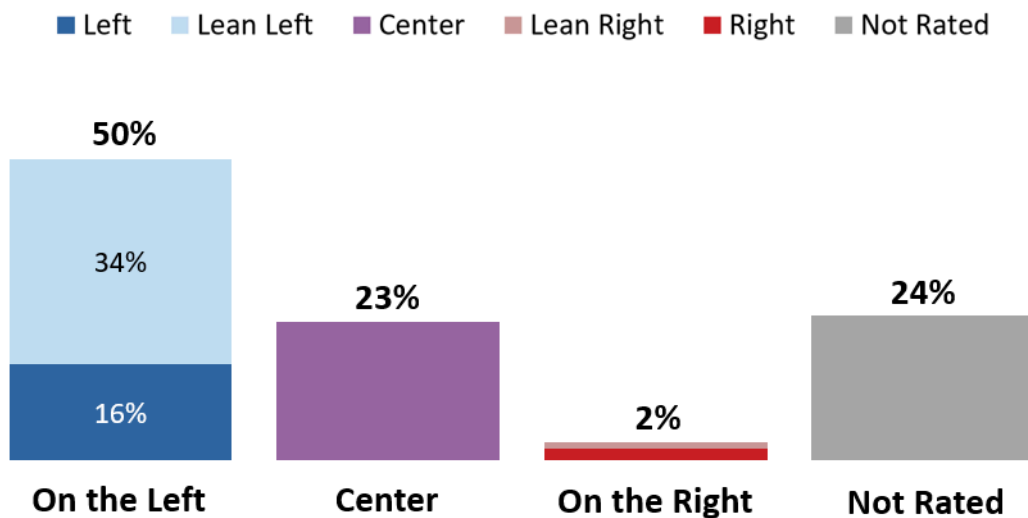

Overview

An AllSides analysis of [Apple News](#) in October 2025 found that it displayed more sources with an AllSides Media Bias Rating™ on the left than the center or right.

Of 166 articles evaluated over a two-week period, **50% were from outlets on the left (16% Left, 34% Lean Left), 23% from Center-rated outlets, and 2% from outlets on the right (2% Right, 1% Lean Right).**

The analysis looked explicitly at Apple News’ “Top Stories” and “Trending Stories” sections, which are not personalized for individual users.

The results of the October 2025 AllSides Apple News Analysis were quite consistent with AllSides’ comparative [2023 analysis](#), in which 53% of articles were from outlets on the left and 1% on the right.

The analysis, conducted from October 6–19, 2025, cross-referenced articles curated on Apple News with the [AllSides Media Bias Rating™](#) for each source. [AllSides Media Bias Ratings™](#) are determined by a methodology that reflects the average judgment of all Americans.

The [Wall Street Journal \(Center bias\)](#), BuzzFeed (Not Rated), and [Washington Post \(Lean Left bias\)](#) were the most commonly curated sources.

Note that this analysis does not investigate whether the political leanings or biases displayed by Apple News are intentional. Whether Apple News should provide a broader or more balanced diversity of perspectives, and whether that would support or hinder a healthier democratic society, is a philosophical or ethical question beyond the bounds of this analysis, which is descriptive only.

Purpose & Methodology

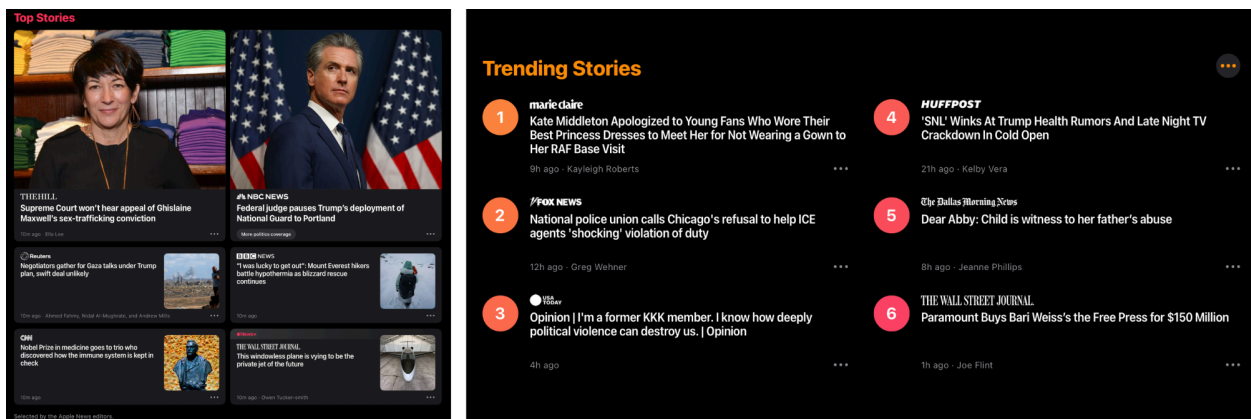
AllSides conducted this media bias analysis of Apple News to determine the political bias of the aggregator based on the media outlets it curates.

Content Collection

AllSides collected the top stories displayed on Apple News over the course of a two-week period from October 6–19, 2025, at 10:00am ET each day. This consisted of pulling from the “Top Stories” and “Trending Stories” of the application.

Because the “Top Stories” and “Trending Stories” sections are unaffected by algorithms or personalization, these were the two sections AllSides chose to analyze for this report. The “Top Stories” section appears at the top of the application, and “Trending Stories” often appears under a personalized “For You” section.

For example, the “Top Stories” and “Trending Stories” sections appeared as follows on October 6, 2025:



How AllSides Made This Analysis as Objective as Possible

In an effort to be as objective as possible in the analysis, **AllSides only took the bias of the media outlet into account — not the content of the article itself.** For example, any article curated from The Wall Street Journal News was considered Center, reflecting the outlet’s overall AllSides Media Bias Rating at the time of the analysis. AllSides Media Bias Ratings reflect the average view of people across the political spectrum, not one individual or group. AllSides’ media bias rating methodology is based on Blind Bias Surveys of Americans across the political spectrum and expert panel reviews by a multipartisan group, preventing one elite group or individual from having a disproportionate impact on the ratings.

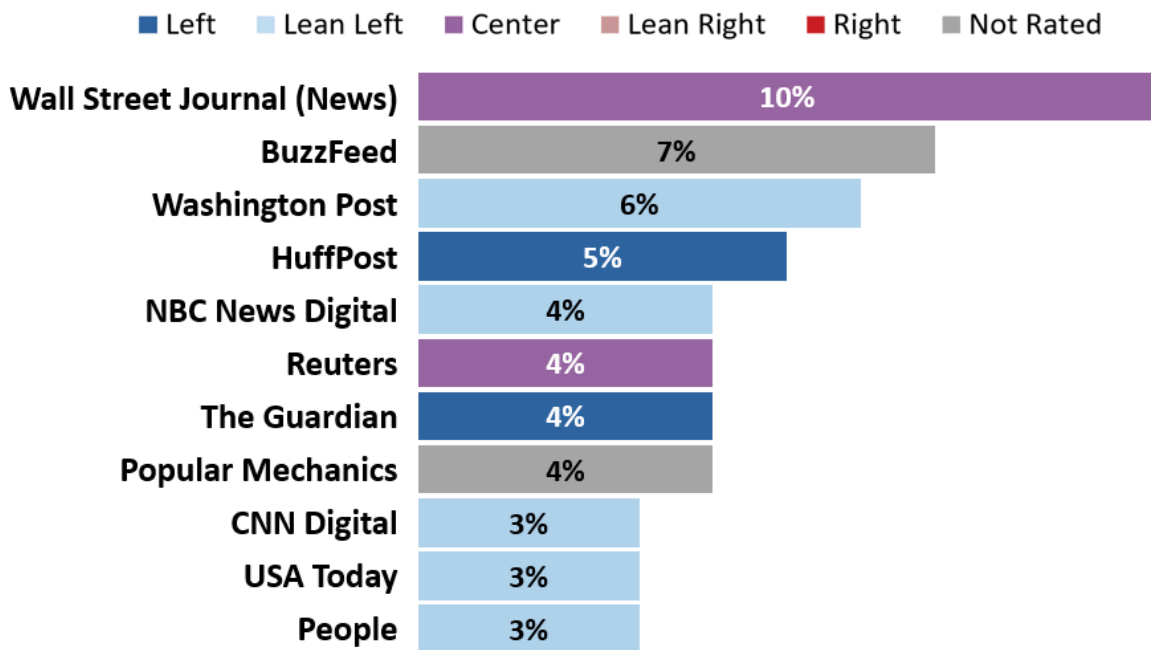
In-Depth Findings

The AllSides analysis found that AllSides more often aggregated news articles from outlets on the left than outlets on the right.

Top Outlets Curated

Of the 166 total articles analyzed, the top five sources appearing the most often were [Wall Street Journal News \(Center bias\)](#), BuzzFeed (Not Rated), [Washington Post \(Lean Left bias\)](#), [HuffPost \(Left bias\)](#), and [NBC News Digital \(Lean Left bias\)](#).

Top News Sources Curated on Apple News with Corresponding AllSides Media Bias Rating™



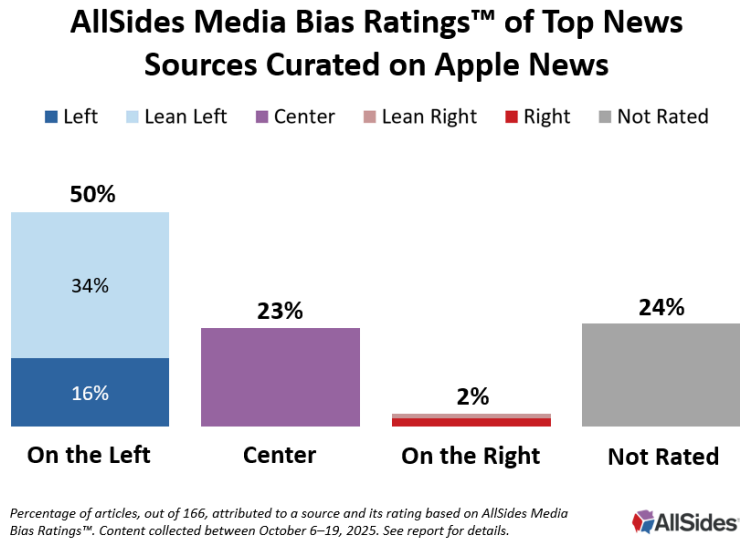

Of all outlets curated in the analysis — of which there were 65 — two were from the right: [Fox News Digital \(Right bias\)](#) and [The Telegraph \(Lean Right bias\)](#). Fox News appeared three times and The Telegraph appeared once.

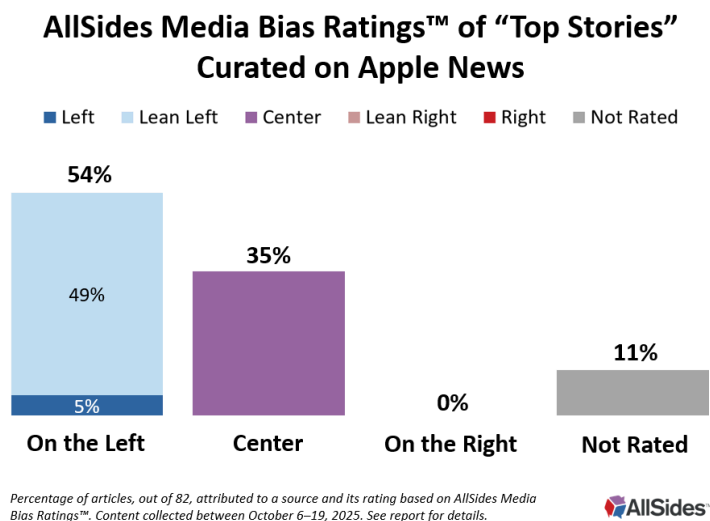
Bias of Outlets Curated

Of all 166 articles analyzed, 50% were from outlets on the left (16% Left, 34% Lean Left), 23% from Center-rated outlets, and 2% from outlets on the right (2% Right, 1% Lean Right). Twenty four percent of articles were from outlets not rated by AllSides.



“Top Stories” Section

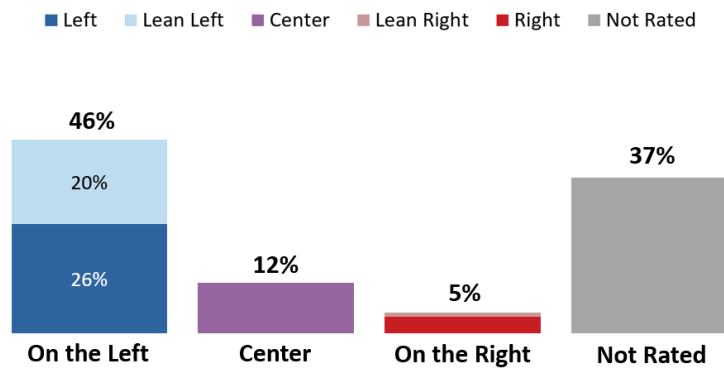
Apple News’ “Top Stories” section is selected by its editors and is unaffected by personalization. Of articles curated just in this section, of which 82 articles were evaluated, 54% were from outlets on the left (5% Left, 49% Lean Left), 35% from Center-rated outlets, and 0% from outlets on the right. Eleven percent of articles were from outlets not rated by AllSides.



“Trending Stories” Section

A total of 84 articles were evaluated in Apple News’ “Trending Stories” section, where 46% were from outlets on the left (26% Left, 20% Lean Left), 12% from Center-rated outlets, and 5% from outlets on the right (4% Right, 1% Lean Right). Thirty seven percent of articles were from outlets not rated by AllSides.

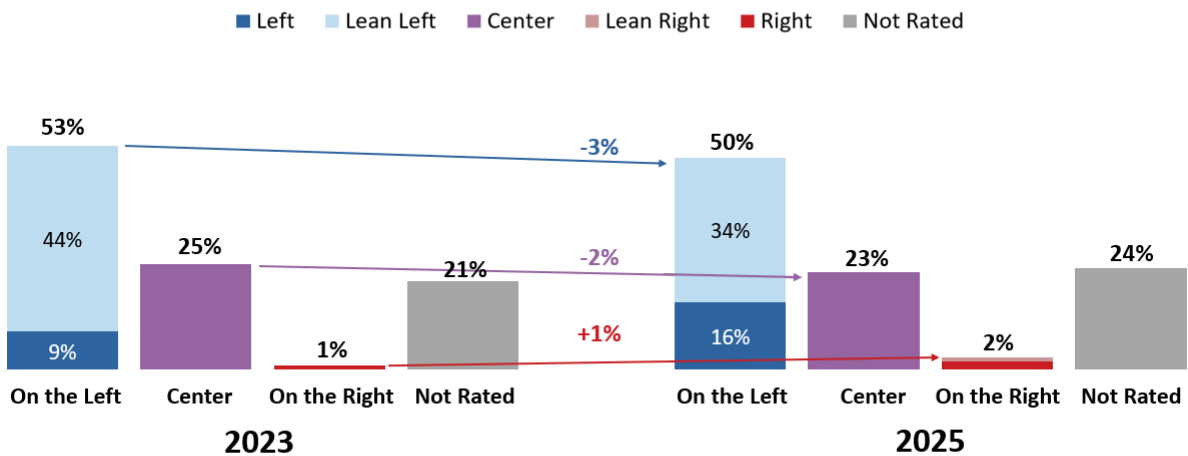


2023 and 2025 Data Compared

AllSides conducted a [similar analysis of Apple News in 2023](#) of 252 articles curated by the aggregator.

The 2023 analysis found 53% of articles were from outlets on the left (9% Left, 44% Lean Left), 25% from Center-rated outlets, and 1% from outlets on the right (1% Right, 0% Lean Right). Twenty one percent of articles were from outlets not rated by AllSides.

Comparatively, the results were relatively stable from 2023 to 2025. A 3% decline in outlets on the left, 2% decline in Center-rated outlets, and 1% gain in outlets on the right were observed.

Rating Changes Over Time

Note that while the 2023 and 2025 analyses used the same methodologies, AllSides Media Bias Ratings change over time, which affect the comparison. Notably, [The Guardian](#) was curated 4% of the time in both years. It was categorized as Lean Left in 2023 and shifted to Left in 2024 following an updated AllSides rating, and is reflected as such in both charts above. AllSides has also expanded its ratings, so some sources may have moved from Not Rated to Left, Lean Left, Center, Lean Right, or Right.

Background on Apple News

Apple News is a news aggregation application created by Apple for use on Apple devices, including iPhone®, Mac®, and iPad®, via the *News* app. Apple News has both a free and paid version; the paid version is called [Apple News+](#) and allows users to pay a subscription fee to access paywalled content from some publications.

The aggregator works by [pulling in RSS or Atom feeds](#) from publications. Publications include a variety of sources, including news websites, newspapers, and magazines.

Apple News has many [personalization options](#), which it describes on its [website](#), stating, “As you read, Apple News gets a better read on your interests, and suggests relevant stories that you can easily find throughout the app.” Users can follow or block outlets in the app to either encourage or prevent them from appearing in various personalized sections, such as the “For You” section, or among hundreds of topics sections, such as politics, environment, technology, and many more. Entire topics can also be blocked by the user.

Apple News [states](#) that its editors curate some sections of the app, such as the “Top Stories” and “Trending Stories” sections. Apple explains that because the stories that appear in these sections are hand-selected by editors themselves, they are not affected by users blocking publications. Apple [states](#) on a support page, “Blocking is not supported in Top Stories or other groups curated by the Apple News editors, who vet each story in those groups for quality and accuracy.”

AllSides normalizes these data based on respondent ideology to ensure that the audience reflects the social and political diversity of the nation.
- **Editorial Reviews** — A multipartisan panel conducts in-depth reviews of a media outlet. The Editorial Review Panel includes people from across the political spectrum. During this process, each reviewer independently evaluates and suggests a rating for the source. Then, the group discusses individual findings, shares impressions, and comes to an agreement on the result.
- **Third Party Data** — When available and relevant, data that is conducted by a transparent, credible source may inform AllSides Media Bias Ratings™. AllSides always notes which third-party analyses it has taken to account on the source page for any outlet.
- **Community Feedback** — Visitors to AllSides.com can vote on the rating for any outlet. This feedback does not determine our ratings, but may trigger a deeper review.
- **Independent Reviews** — An AllSides reviewer assesses content and comes to a general conclusion on a source’s bias. This is AllSides’ lowest level of analysis, usually undertaken to give initial, low-confidence ratings.
